## English B 1204



This course covers a wide range of skills: writing, reading, speaking and listening.

In addition to communication skills students will have opportunities to work with others, analyse and solve problems and take charge of their own learning.

The content is as follows:

- A Shakespeare play
- Study of media texts
- Writing to argue/persuade/advise/analyse/review/comment/inform/explain/describe
- Modern poetry (Anthology)
- Different cultures (Anthology)
- Speaking and listening skills.

Progression from this qualification could be made to GCE Advanced Level English Language or Literature.

### Examination

Course work carries 40% of the total; 20% for three assessments in speaking and listening and another 20% for three submissions in writing. There are two final examinations for 60% of the total mark.

The content is as follows:

- Prose: the study of substantial texts published before and after 1914
- Poetry: comparative study, featuring poems published before and after 1914
- Drama: the study of works published before and after 1914.

Progression from this qualification could be made to GCE Advanced Level English Language or Literature.

### Examination

A portfolio of written and oral course work must be submitted and this course work constitutes 30% of the total mark; the final examination carries 70% of the total mark.

### Entry requirements

Attendance at an initial assessment and guidance interview is essential.
